Report of Analysis on Student Satisfaction Survey

Key Indicator-2.7.1

Under Criterion II of Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

Students are the most important stakeholders in the institution. Their feedback reflects the quality of the institution, both in academics and administration. Hence, a survey is conducted by the Department of IQAC with our students to measure their satisfaction levels with the teaching, learning, and evaluation processes. For this, we used the NAAC-suggested questionnaire for this survey. The feedback was collected from the final-year students in 2024. In all questions 0, 1, 2, 3, and 4, a five-point scale is used. If students choose **4**, it can be considered fully **satisfied**. If a student chooses **3 or 2**, it can be considered satisfied. If the student chooses **0 or 1**, it can be considered unsatisfied.

The analysis is done question-wise and consolidated to get the overall report.

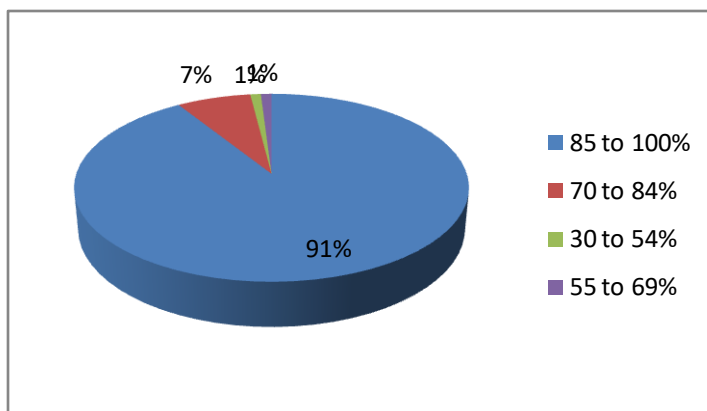

91% choose 100% completion of syllabus and 7% choose about 80% completion of syllabus.

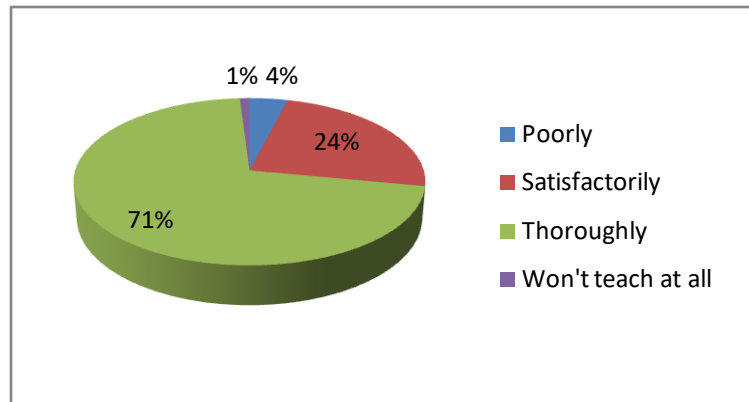
2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

71% respond satisfactorily while 28% respond thoroughly 1% respond indifferently.

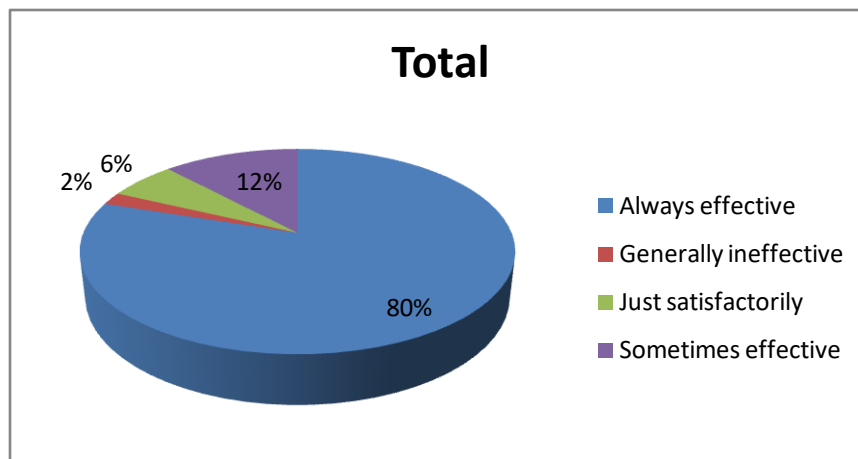
3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

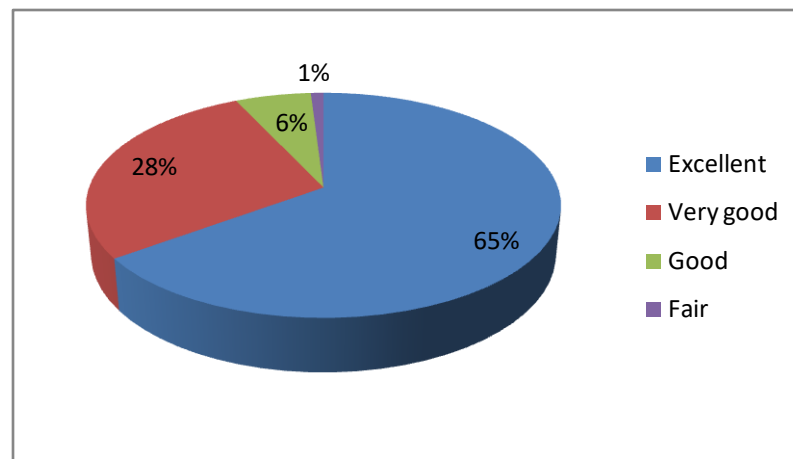


80% respond always effective, 12% respond Sometimes effective and 6% respond Just satisfactorily.

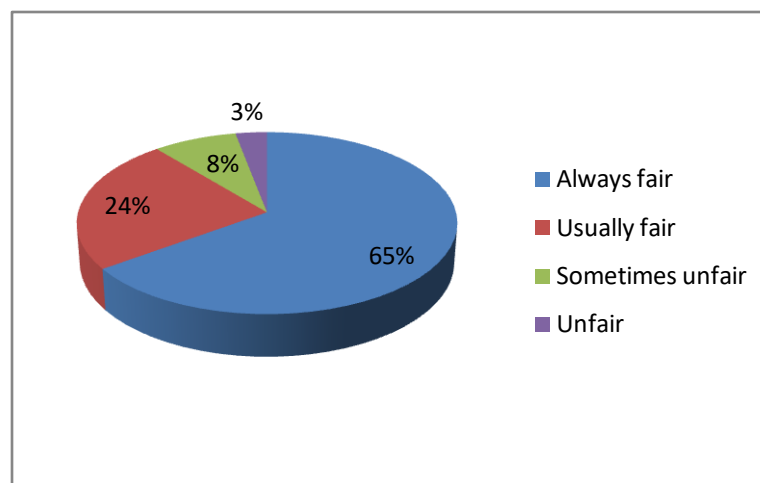

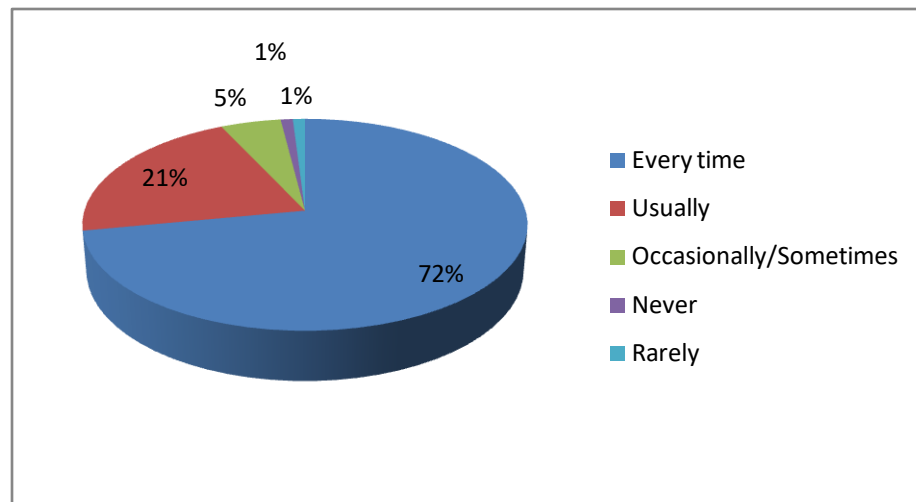

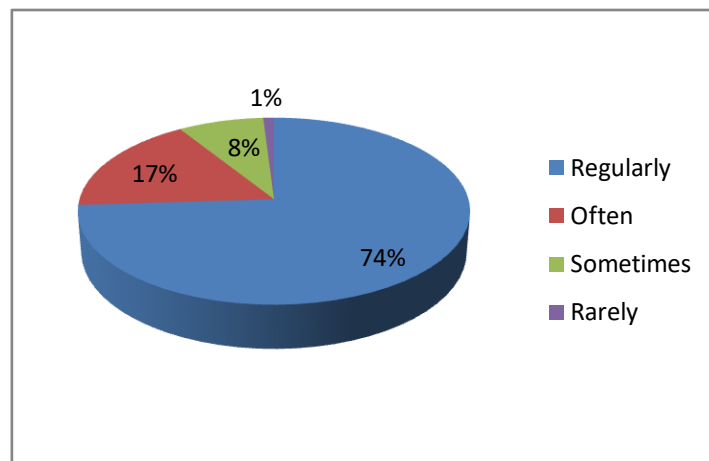

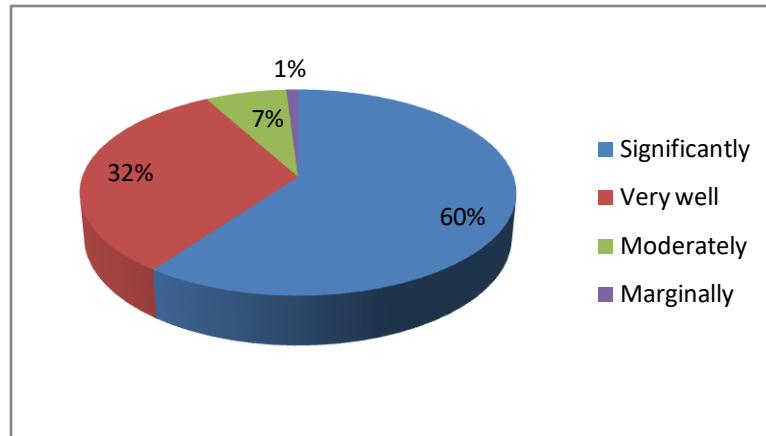

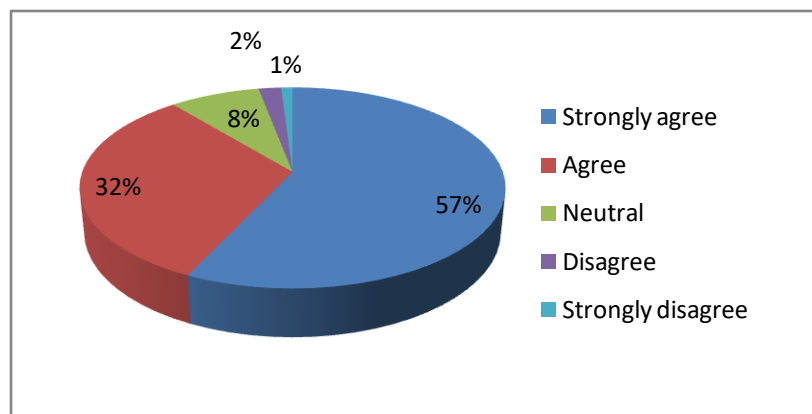

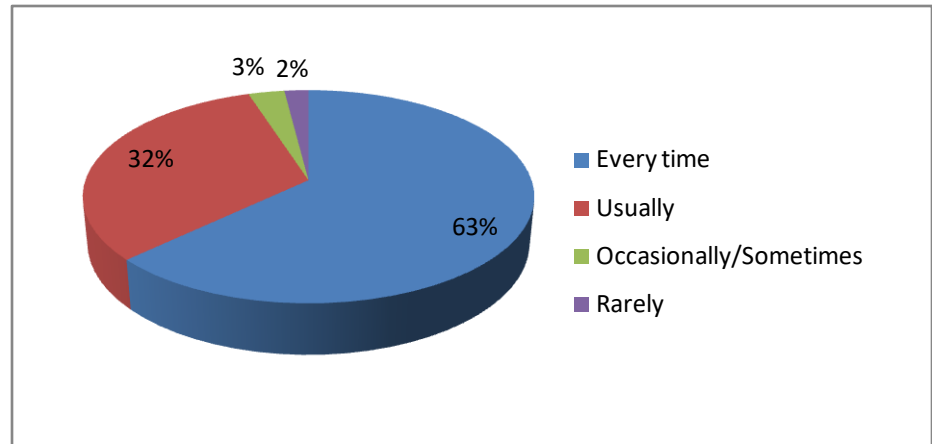

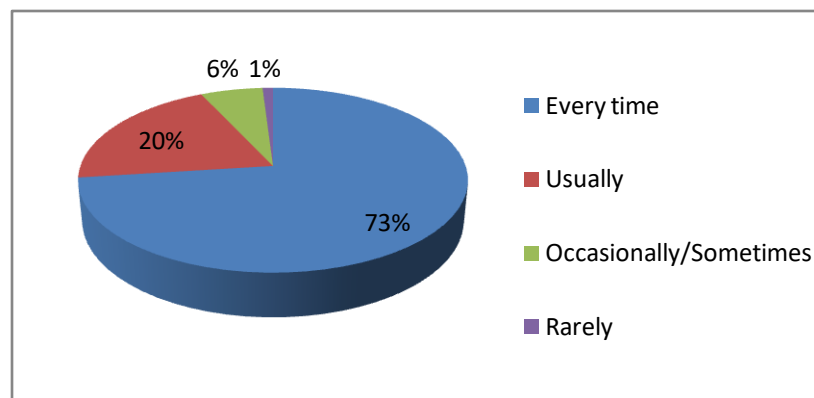

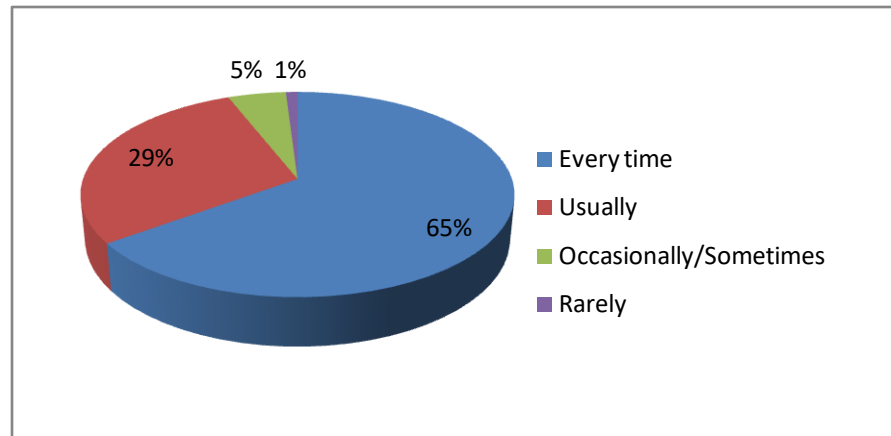

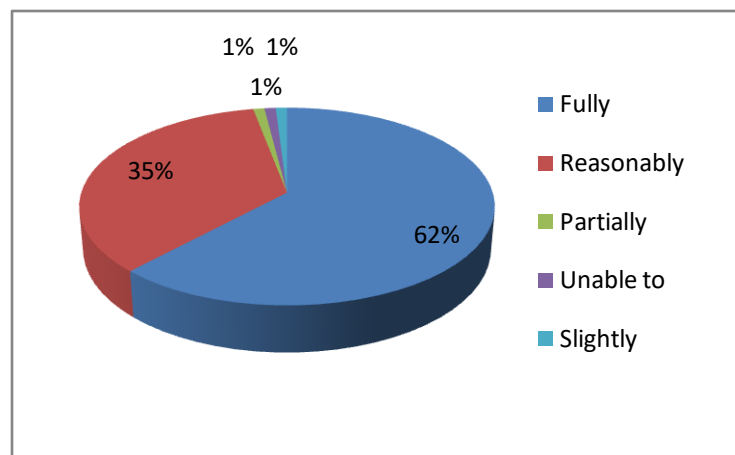

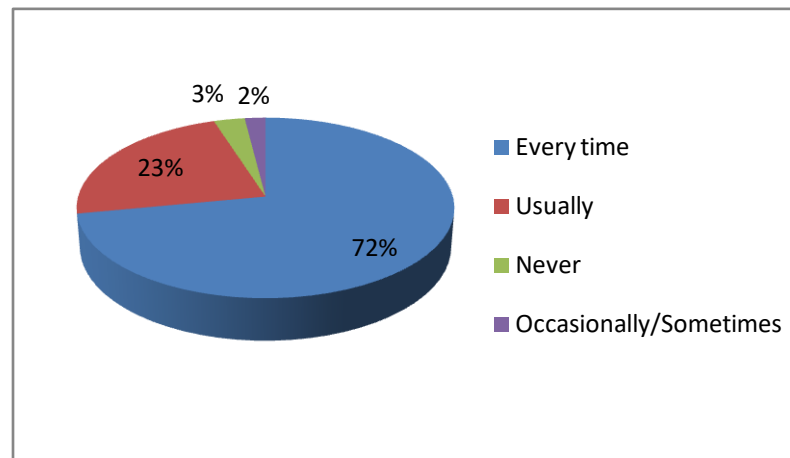

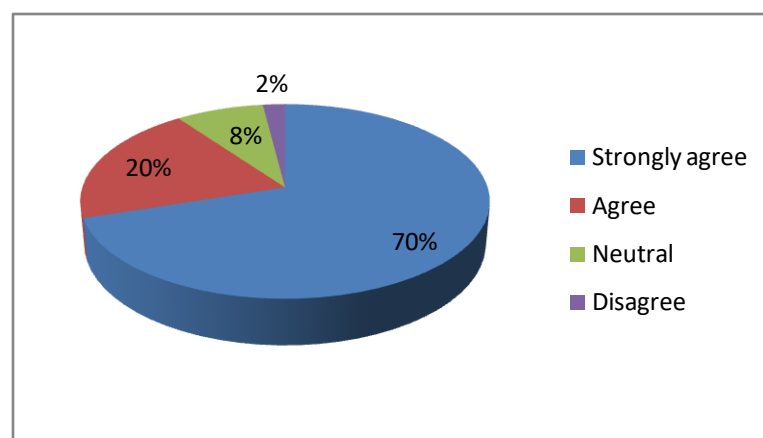

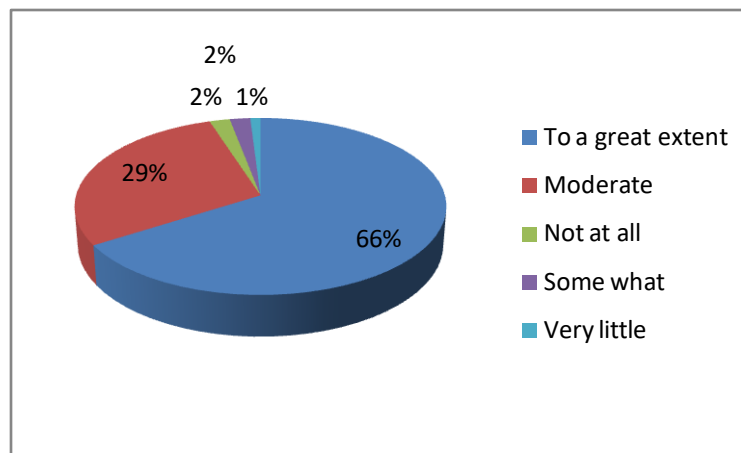

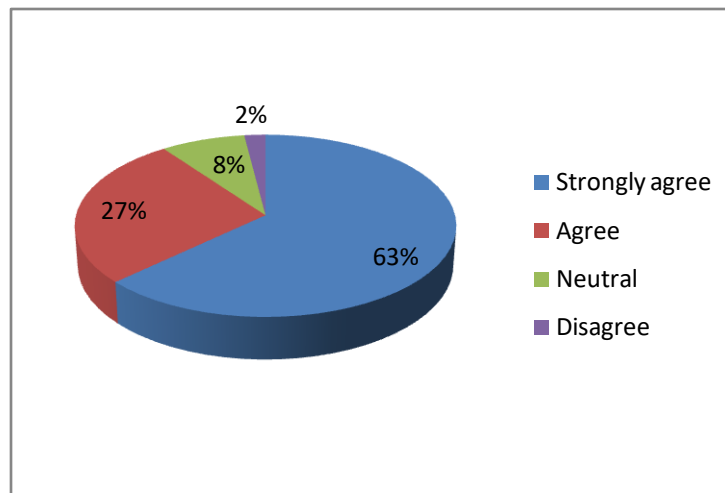

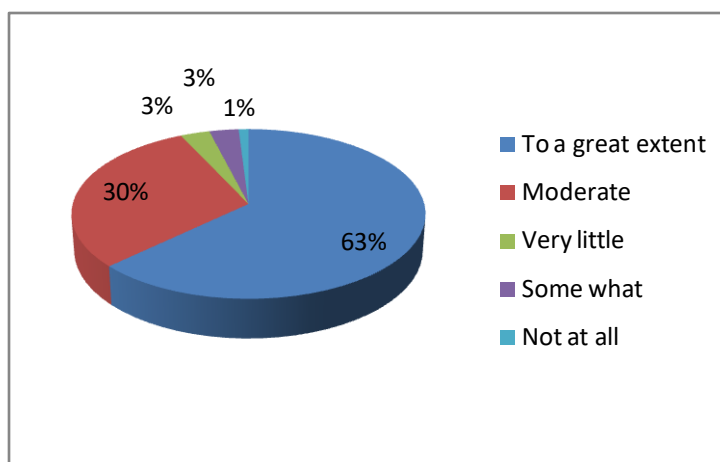

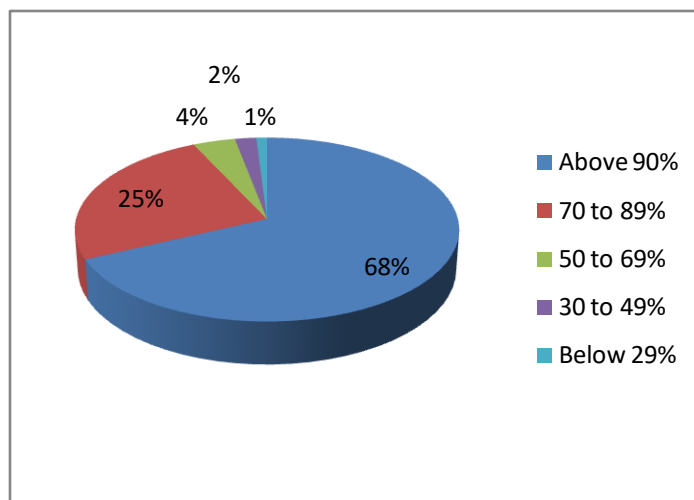

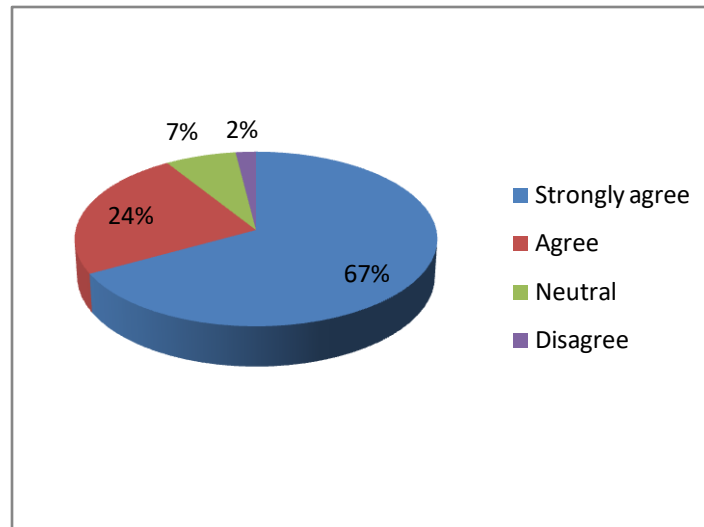

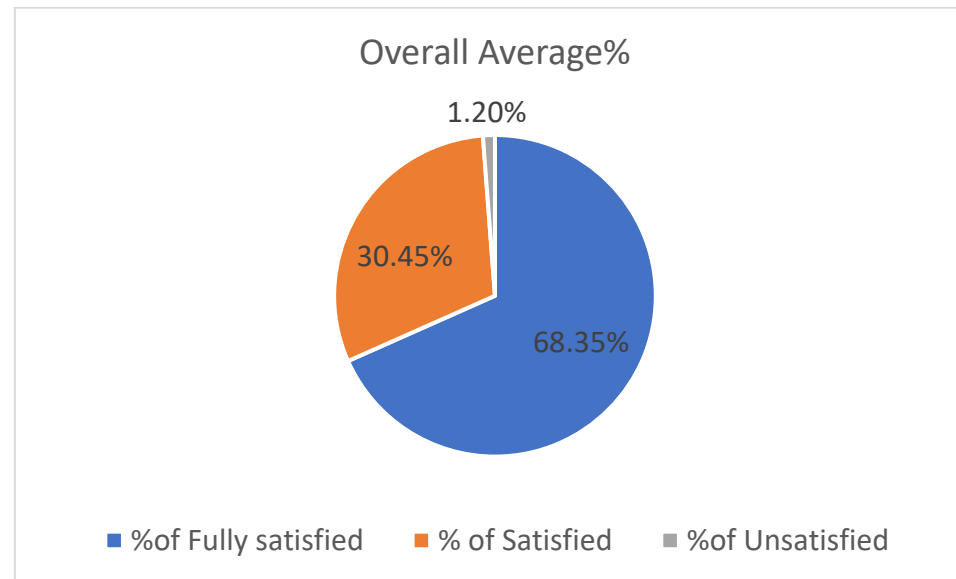

Report on Student Satisfaction Survey by the Department of IQAC:

1. Overall, 68.35% of students are satisfied with the completion of the syllabus, the way of teaching, and the use of ICT tools.
2. Overall, 99% of students are satisfied with the quality of the teaching and learning process.
3. 30.45% of students are satisfied with the pedagogies used by the teachers and the monitoring of students through ward counseling.
4. Only 1% of the students are unsatisfied with the process.
5. The IQAC team is determined to find gaps in the teaching-learning process for the satisfaction of the students.

The identified gaps

1. Some of the Students require employability skills and communication skills.

Suggestion: Hence, it is suggested to join the students in the Skill Hub Center and the Jawahar Knowledge Center, which are located in the premises of the college, for possessing those skills.

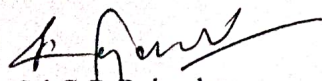
2. Some of the Students not getting opportunity in participating extra-curricular activities.

Suggestion: It is suggested that students are divided into three categories: advanced, slow, and average/moderate learners. Based on the division and their interest, they are kept involved in NSS, NCC, RRC, games, and sports so that all students get opportunities in extracurricular activities.

3. Some of the Students not able to identify their goals in life.

Suggestion: All faculty members are requested to hold career guidance sessions for their students, providing information about both higher education and job opportunities, so that students can make informed decisions about their future careers.
