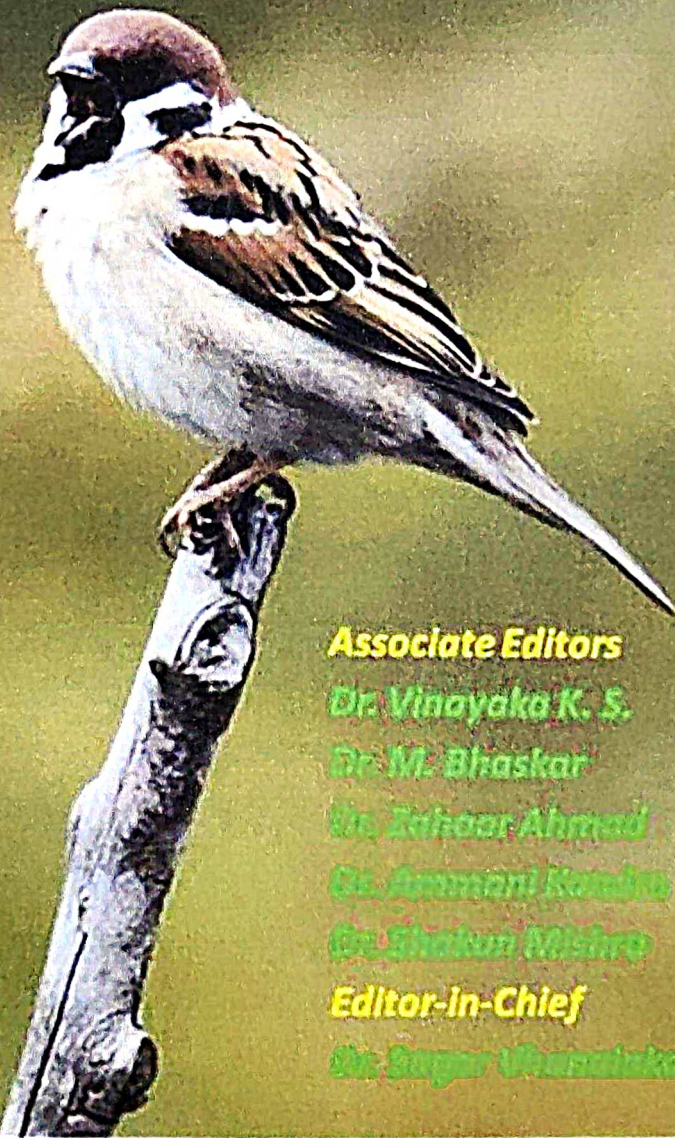


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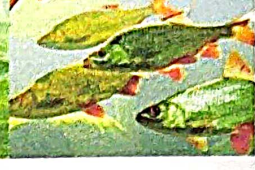
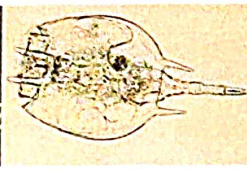
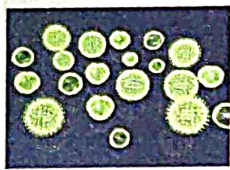
  
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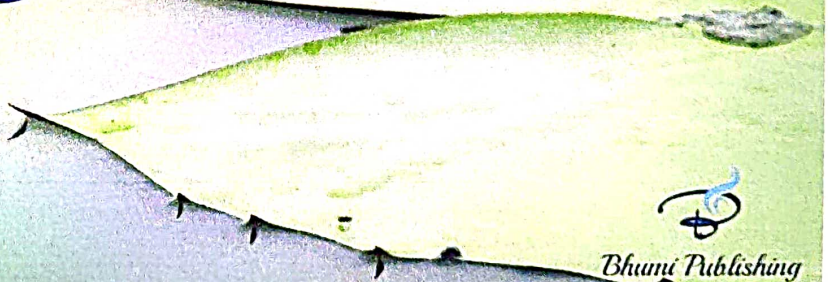
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# Prejudice towards one Gender is Imbalance to the Society
